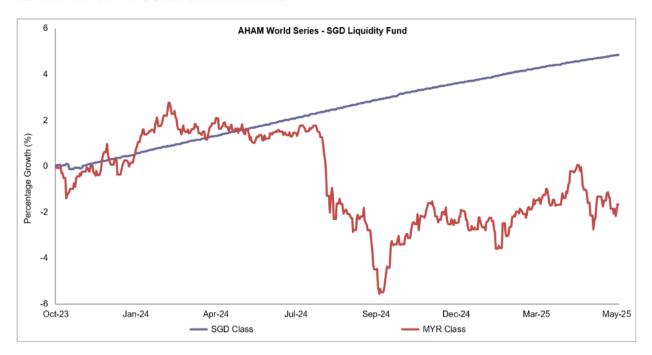

Income Distribution Breakdown

No distribution was declared by the Fund over the financial period under review.

Strategies Employed

The Target Fund aims to meet its objectives by providing liquidity and delivering returns comparable to SGD deposit rates. To achieve this, the SGD Cash Fund focuses on generating alpha through strategic management of the Weighted Average Maturity (WAM) and by identifying attractive rate opportunities across various tenors. The Fund allocates between Fixed Deposits and MAS Bills while carefully considering banks' Asset Liability Management (ALM) strategies and corporate needs. This approach allows the Target Fund to optimize its yield opportunities while maintaining the required liquidity levels.

Market Review

In the first half of 2025, financial markets experienced a dramatic shift in tone, largely influenced by heightened geopolitical uncertainty, evolving monetary policies, and recalibrated trade dynamics. Following the November 2024 U.S. presidential election, the return of an unconventional administration under Donald Trump introduced a new global order, marked by unilateral policy shifts and increasing protectionism. This period saw markets

struggle to price in the potential implications of revived trade tensions, tariff announcements, and policy unpredictability, resulting in increased volatility across asset classes.

Bond markets were notably turbulent. In the U.S., the 10-year Treasury yield oscillated within a 114-basis-point range from 3.60% to 4.74%, reflecting investor uncertainty around inflation, growth, and fiscal policy direction. In Europe, the ECB initiated its first rate cut in June 2024 after a long pause, while other central banks adopted a varied mix of rate hikes, pauses, and cuts depending on local inflationary pressures and economic conditions. The Fed's initial rate cut in late 2024 signaled a shift in tone, though the path of future easing remained uncertain.

Meanwhile, Singapore's monetary policy remained relatively stable but cautiously dovish. The Monetary Authority of Singapore (MAS) slightly reduced the slope of its policy band in January and April 2025, responding to earlier strong growth and moderating inflation. The Singapore dollar reflected this moderation, ending mixed against regional currencies. On the asset side, money market and cash strategies gained attention as investors rotated toward safer, more liquid instruments amid elevated macro uncertainty and equity market sensitivity to political developments.

Risk assets remained volatile, with global equities experiencing sectoral divergences and shifts in leadership, while credit markets showed dispersion between investment-grade and high-yield segments. In this landscape, cash and liquidity funds offered a rare combination of stability, real yield, and low volatility—positioning themselves as an increasingly strategic allocation within diversified portfolios.

Investment Outlook

Looking ahead to the second half of 2025, the outlook remains complex and fraught with both opportunity and risk. Central to the investment narrative is the evolving stance of global central banks. While the fight against inflation appears to have moderated, the urgency to cut rates has also waned. Policymakers remain cautious, with their decisions now heavily influenced by geopolitical developments—particularly trade tariffs and currency movements linked to the Trump administration's renewed focus on "America First" policies. These policies have the potential to introduce cost-push inflation, complicating the monetary easing trajectory many had expected at the start of the year.

For investors based in Singapore, the domestic economic environment remains resilient. Singapore's GDP growth has consistently met or exceeded expectations, supported by strong fundamentals. However, monetary policy has entered an observation phase, with the MAS opting for slight adjustments rather than aggressive easing. This cautious tone is echoed across several ASEAN markets. Against this backdrop, yields in the shortend of the SGD curve have already recalibrated, suggesting that opportunities may now lie in tactical positioning and curve management rather than directional rate bets.

The Target Fund remains well-positioned in this landscape. The Target Fund will continue to focus on extracting alpha through careful management of weighted average maturities (WAM), duration positioning across short-tenor instruments, and a disciplined allocation between fixed deposits and MAS Bills. Over the past six months, longer WAM positioning has benefited from the softening in both global and domestic interest rates. However, with renewed concerns around trade tariffs and inflation resurfacing, the Target Fund is prepared to reassess its WAM strategy as conditions evolve.

Diversification across counterparties remains a critical focus. The Target Fund continues to actively manage its exposure list, ensuring optimal pricing and liquidity while monitoring broader developments in global banking and credit conditions. Amid a backdrop of possible capital inefficiencies due to fragmented global trade, and ongoing geopolitical risks—from Europe to Asia—the Target Fund offers a compelling case for investors seeking capital preservation, daily liquidity, and competitive yields. As markets shift between hope and hesitation, a disciplined and flexible cash strategy anchored in strong risk management will remain essential.
